



I started my first garden almost 4 years ago when we still lived in Columbus and let me tell you, it was a disaster. With gardening you really have to get in the right mindset, you have to tell yourself that every "failure" is just a new lesson, an opportunity to learn and be better.

To get started you need to look up your planting zone by your zip code, here in 43019 we are in zone 5b. Finding your zone will tell you your first and last frost dates and give you a planting schedule. Now that you know what to plant and when, you're going to want to pick out quality seeds, remember, cheaper is not always better! I prefer companies like Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds, Botanical Interests, and Johnny's Selected Seeds because they have the most reliable germination rates in my experience. There is nothing more frustrating than carefully sowing a tray of

seeds just to have half of them not even germinate. It's very easy to go overboard picking out seeds, there are so many beautiful varieties but try to be realistic about what you have time and space for. I like to choose varieties I can't get at the grocery store. To me, I don't want to slave over my garden just to harvest a Black Beauty zucchini that I can get from Kroger for seventy-five cents. Finally, be sure to select varieties that you and your family will actually eat.

I personally like to select my seeds before I plan out my garden on paper. I just measure out my space, figure out how many of each plant I want and move things around until I have a layout that I like. When laying out your garden on paper, remember that some plants like being together and some don't, you can look up a comprehensive list of companion plants online. Crop rotation is also important for

the health of your soil, optimizing soil nutrients, and to help combat pests and weed pressure. When you sow the same plant in the same spot year after year, you are breaking down the soil structure as the crop pulls the same nutrients from the soil over and over again.

With your planting schedule in hand and your garden laid out on paper, you can begin sowing seeds indoors. Starting seeds sounds harder than it is and it's just another thing in gardening that takes practice and perseverance. I like using a soil blocker, it saves plastic, is cheaper than buying pots, and keeps your plants from getting root bound like in a pot. You can use recycled takeout boxes, baking trays, or plastic seed flats to put your soil blocks in, just use what you have. Each plant is going to need a different temperature and amount of light in order to germinate so check the back of your seed packet for specifications.

THE J.B. FOOTE **FOUNDRY BELLS**

A Fredericktown Legacy from 1851 - 2014

Before smartphones and instant messaging, bells were an essential method of communication. Small, tinkling bells alerted shop keepers that a customer needed their assistance. Hand-held bells called children to school. The ringing of the dinner bell brought farm workers in from the field. A wildly clanging bell indicated an emergency, or the imminent approach of a horse drawn fire truck. The somber tolling of church bells summoned the faithful to Sunday worship during life and ushered them to their final resting place when the journey of life came to an end. Bells were very much a part of everyday life.

A Fredericktown businessman, L.D. Rankin, determined that the demand for bells and other forged equipment, like stoves and plows, could be a valuable source of income personally, as well as a way to draw business to the town. In 1851, Mr. Rankin established the L.D. Rankin Bell Factory on a plot of land which is now the parking lot beside the Fredericktown Historical Museum. The bells produced there were cast in different sizes based on use with the size cast into the bell as a number. Each bell was also engraved with the inscription Made by L.D. Rankin Fredericktown O. Secured New Composition Bell.

Following the death of L.D. Rankin in May of 1867, the foundry was sold to Will Cummings, the owner of the local lumber yard. Mr. Cummings changed the name to The Fredericktown Bell Company, which continued until the 1880's when the foundry was sold again.

James Bedell Foote purchased the foundry from Will Cummings and changed the name to The J.B. Foote Foundry. Mr. Foote had big plans for the foundry, beginning with an aggressive marketing plan to expand the sale of farm equipment and bells. The hiring of an ambitious salesman by the name of Myron T. Herrick to travel the countryside in the company's horse and buggy drumming up sales was the first step. The success of Mr. Herrick's efforts enabled substantial expansion of the business. Sales were no longer limited to the local market. For more than 20 years, J.B. Foote Foundry bells were sold to churches, schools, fire departments, shipping lines, colleges, and railroads throughout the United States and to markets worldwide. In 1913, the foundry was sold to Ralph Struble and Frank Zeig. Bells continued to be marketed under the J.B. Foote Foundry name with concrete block machines, playground equipment and cement mixers added to the inventory.

Guy V. Fearn, an accountant, purchased the foundry in 1930. Under his ownership, company operations improved dramatically, and cement mixers and bells were sold nationally to well-known retailers like Sears Roebuck & Company. The company continued to prosper, eventually expanding to include three divisions which produced gray iron castings, concrete mixers and, in later years, transmissions for self-propelled and riding lawnmowers. Following the death of Mr. Fearn in 1940, his wife, Goldye, assumed ownership of the company. With the help of plant manager, C.R. Ruggles, Mrs, Fearn was able to improve the foundry's operation substantially, allowing the business to continue to thrive.



In 1987, the foundry was sold to Fredericktown resident, Thomas Updike, who modernized the foundry process. In 1998, the company moved operations to its current location at 283 N. Main Street and completed a \$5.2 million foundry modernization and expansion. By 2007, the market for bells had declined and the foundry was no longer casting bells. In conjunction with the Fredericktown bicentennial celebration that year, however, a number of bells were cast which were sold at auction to help fund the year-long celebration.

Unfortunately, economic constraints caused by increasing operating costs, new EPA compliance regulations and a shifting away from iron products in favor of hard plastics resulted in the closing of the foundry in 2014. Continuous operation from 1851 to 2014 made the J.B. Foote Foundry one of the oldest operating green sand foundries in the United States. Initially limited to the production stoves, plows and bells, the company had, within 50 years, expanded its production to include castings for the agricultural and machine tool markets and its own line of cast iron cement block machines. At its closing, production at the foundry also included cored, machinable castings in both gray and ductile iron. Sadly, many of the bells cast at the foundry were lost to the World War II scrap metal drives held to boost the home front war effort. Interest in the history of the bells, however, is still very strong and many people continue to contact the Fredericktown Historical Museum for information on bells they have purchased or received as gifts.



COOK'S CORNER: STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKE

Late spring ushers in one of the seasons favorite desserts... old fashioned Strawberry Shortcake. This Betty Crocker recipe uses Bisquick™ for an easy, flaky shortcake shortcut that doesn't skimp on taste.

Ingredients:

1 quart (4 cups) strawberries, sliced

14 cup sugar

2 1/3 cups Original Bisquick™ mix

½ cup milk

3 tablespoons sugar

3 tablespoons butter, melted

½ cup heavy whipping cream

- 1. Heat oven to 425°F.
- 2. In large bowl, mix strawberries and 1/4 cup sugar; set aside to allow juice to form.

2020 - A Year of Change

Fredericktown EMS

Fredericktown EMS services a total 118 square miles & approximately 9,700 residents in northwestern Knox County. Formed in 1978, the ambulance district consists of Merlin, Middlebury, Pike, Wayne & the northern half of Morris Twps, as well as, the Village of Fredericktown. The department staffs the EMS Chief, 4 career Paramedics and 27 part-time staff or volunteers.

In 2020, the department responded to 932 incidents and completed 961 patient encounters – a 5% increase over 2019. A total of 566 patients were transported to local hospital as follows:

513 – to Knox Community Hospital 50 – to Ohio Health Mansfield

3 - to other hospitals via medical helicopter

Rapid response times are paramount in an emergency. Fredericktown EMS averages a 1 minute 30 seconds "en route" response time with "en route" to "on scene" response time of 6 minutes 48 seconds.

In 2020, the department replaced its 2010 F-450 Horton Ambulance with a 2020 F-450 McCoy/Miller ambulance.












Fredericktown Fire

The Fredericktown Community Fire Department run district covers approximately 118 square miles in Morris "A", Pike, Middlebury, Wayne & Berlin Townships and the Village of Fredericktown. The department currently operates out of 2 locations – the main station at 139 Columbus Rd Fredericktown & a second location at 18439 Earnest Rd in Butler.

The FCFD has a total of 25 paid/call members, of which, 2 are full-time personnel. The remainder serve on a paid-volunteer basis outside of their full-time profession. The department provides 2 trainings/month to insure that our firefighters are trained adequately to respond to the needs of our community. Operating on a \$280,000 annual budget provided by tax levies, the department ran on a total of 284 fire calls as is outlined in the chart below.

Fredericktown Police

The Police Levy was renewed by the local voters with an affirmative vote of 71% in November 2020. The Fredericktown community has shown great pride in its Police Department and the passage of the Police Levy ensured continued around-the-clock police protection for the Fredericktown Community. This levy will expire in 2025. Not only does the Police Levy provide approximately \$110,000 in revenue per year for Fredericktown Police Department operating expenses, but it also frees up General Fund monies to be used toward other expenses throughout the Village. The current Police Levy will expire December 31st, 2024.

The department had a slight increase from 2019 in calls and a total of 88 criminal charges during 2020. These charges are represented below:

FREDERICKTOWN 2021 STATE OF THE VILLAGE REPORT

The year 2020 was a year of unprecedented challenges for the Village of Fredericktown. The onset of COVID-19 in the late winter months brought about a significant amount of immediate unprecedented change and financial uncertainty. The Fredericktown business community has shown resilience through extremely challenging economic times. As the Governor loosens the economic constraints on local businesses, the local economy is showing indications of improvement. This economic recovery allows the community to look forward to a brighter future, as we can only hope the worst days of COVID-19 are behind us.

In 2018, the Village had been awarded a federally funded grant administered through the Ohio Department of Transportation. The Transportation Alternate Program (TAP) will provide funding of \$922,000 covering 95% of the construction costs of Phase I of the Fredericktown Streetscape Project.

The Streetscape Project includes Main Street, from Sandusky Street to Mill Street. This project will entail: replacement of existing traffic lights and cables with new decorative traffic signals and overhead masts; replacement of sidewalks with ADA compliant walks and ramps; and replacement of the existing "copper head" street lighting with decorative LED street lighting. One of the highlights of 2020 accomplishments was the Village successfully applying for additional TAP funding for Phase II of the Streetscape Project. If we do receive this funding, the grant will cover \$542,000 (95%) of the construction costs of Phase II of the Streetscape Project.

In addition to the aforementioned downtown infrastructure improvements, Village Council is partnering with Fredericktown Community Development Foundation and other area agencies in an effort to locate funding that may help offset the cost of facade improvements of




privately owned structures in the downtown business corridor. Construction on the Streetscape Project is scheduled for 2023 and this new look will help make Fredericktown an even better place to live, work, shop, and dine than ever before.

The Village did see some improvements in the downtown area in 2020 as the Interchurch demolished their old structure to make room for a new facility that will open this spring. In addition to the new Interchurch building, a group is currently working on the engineering and design of a splash park, which will be adjacent to the public parking lot on the southeast corner of Main Street and College Street. This splash park will provide a gathering point in the downtown area and hours of summer recreation for kids of all ages.

The 2020 Street Improvement Project was completed in the summer of 2020 and nearly half of the costs of this project were covered by a grant from Ohio Public Works
Commission. The Village has been successful in securing OPWC funding for the past several years and we anticipate receiving OPWC funding for the 2021 Street Improvement Project as well. The estimated construction cost for the 2021 paving is estimated to be around \$230,000.

The local job market held steady in 2020. Some of the larger employers within the Village corporation limits include Fredericktown Local Schools, Unique Metal Designs, Schafer Driveline, and Fredericktown Chevrolet, to name just a few. Kokosing Construction and FT Precision are both located just outside Village corporation limits, but these companies also provide jobs for hundreds of families living in the Fredericktown area. These employers not only provide jobs, but they may also provide products and services to those living in the Fredericktown community. Local employers and employees pay earnings taxes on their profits and wages earned within the Village and many employers pay property taxes as well. 



We use heat mats for our tomatoes and peppers to aid in germination but if I had to go back, I wouldn't have been as worried about having fancy tools and just used what I had. Make due with what you have available to you and get your feet wet before making bigger investments.

Don't be discouraged if you have failures in your first years, trust me, they happen to even the most experienced gardeners. My first year starting seeds, I only had 3 or 4 peppers germinate, I didn't stay on top of weeding my garden and by July it was a disaster I couldn't come back from. I felt like a massive failure, but I used my failure as a learning experience. Like all things in life, gardening takes practice and research, so don't give up just because of a few mess ups, afterall there's always next year. 🬘

The Village has continued to pay down debt. This debt includes: sanitary sewer improvements, waste water infrastructure improvements, water infrastructure improvements, roadway improvements, and the acquisition of land and construction of the Owl Creek Trail.

The Village will continue to reach out and partner with a number of agencies in pooling resources and continuing to in make Fredericktown a great place to live, to work, and to do business.
